DGS is in the midst of, and will continue, an intensive re-education of key personnel on matters related to procurement rules and regulations, legal requirements and segregation of duties.

As we manage the change in leadership at the Fleet Management Division, the individual hired as the new Division Chief will be required to receive full training from the Bureau of Procurement prior to being granted the ability to authorize procurement actions.
